TOM CHAPIN IN CONCERT

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 26TH AT 8PM

Adult albums and kids' albums, contemporary folk and pop, Tom Chapin's music spans styles and generations. For more than thirty years, Chapin has entertained, amused and enlightened audiences of all ages with life-affirming original songs told in a sophisticated array of musical styles. Tom's remarkable musicianship, great songwriting and personal warmth shine through whether he's performing in a concert hall, an outdoor festival, a school, in front of a symphony orchestra or in an intimate coffeehouse. Tom's adult concerts and recordings are sparked by strong, intelligent songwriting with clear, engaging vocals and the intricate, melodic guitar work that has become his trademark. The New York Times calls Tom Chapin "one of the great personalities in contemporary folk music." Rolling Stone says Tom "has an appealing, easy way with songs about emotional connection, grassroots protest, and personal commitment." He says: "Mine is not a traditional music, but it comes from a tradition. My musical heroes are people like Pete Seeger and Woody Guthrie who wrote and sang real songs for real people; for everyone, old, young, and in between." 8pm - Admission is \$25 at the door, or \$22 advance purchase. SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 13 - 7:30PM

GORDON TENTREES IN CONCERT - WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 24 - 7:30PM

Gordie Tentrees is from the cold and rustic Yukon Territory and writes like a disciple to preeminent Texas storytellers on his third album, *Mercy or Sin*. "Alfred" leads off the record, a darkly poignant acoustic tale - "Walks with a hitch, right side hip, reads a dirt palm, right before he spits, thinks on the rain, hollers for the end, Alfred is old his blood ain't thin." But don't settle in for a mellow country/folk album, because he brings his resophonic guitar and stomp board to a roaring "No Integrity Man" for a decidedly blues-rock feel—and a hint of rockabilly on "Same Old Blues." Tentrees and band are relentless road-warriors, with almost 200 dates the past year in Canada and Europe. He brings *Mercy or Sin* to the US in February with a detour to perform at the Olympics in Vancouver Feb. 15-17 for the New Songs New Voices Show. Tentrees was selected as the best of Canada's songwriters to perform during the games. Gordie will also be performing an official showcase at Folk Alliance in Memphis TN and opening for legendary Texan Ray Wylie Hubbard. Joining him on this tour will be Ken Hermanson (banjo, lapsteel, guitar) and Jennie Sosnowski (upright bass). **Doors open at 6:30 and the music begins at 7:30pm. \$5 admission.**
